RETROFIT SOCIAL VALUE AWARD SOUTH EAST LONDON COMMUNITY ENERGY



As part of its commitment to fostering a cleaner, fairer future, **South East London Community Energy (SELCE)** partners with Repowering London to enhance domestic retrofit in Lewisham, Greenwich, Lambeth, and Newham. The Future Fit Homes retrofit service evolved from SELCE's energy advice team, which aided 500 fuel-poor households through grant schemes. This equitable program is offered at no cost or on a not-for-profit basis, focusing on a supportive 'hand-holding' approach throughout the retrofit process. The initiative includes workshops, eligibility checks, free assessments, and referrals to trusted contractors, empowering the community to address energy, housing, health, and climate challenges.



BEST LOCAL AUTHORTY-LED RETROFIT PROGRAMME GREAT YARMOUTH BOROUGH COUNCIL



Great Yarmouth Borough Council's Home Upgrade Grant 2 (HUG2) scheme aims to tackle fuel poverty in off-gas homes with an EPC rating of D or below. In partnership with E.ON, the scheme has delivered average bill savings of £483 per property across 249 homes for vulnerable residents. A total of 351 energy efficiency measures have been installed, including loft insulation, cavity wall insulation, Solar PV, and Air Source Heat Pumps, with plans for 12 park homes to receive external wall insulation. The HUG2 scheme has reduced household energy consumption by 324,755 kWh/m²/year, achieving CO2 savings of 325 tonnes annually.





Rykneld Homes, representing North East Derbyshire District Council, is implementing a multi-phase retrofit decarbonisation scheme targeting various non-traditional housing types. As one of the largest independent retrofit projects under SHDF Wave 2.1 in England, the £21 million initiative partners with Sustainable Building Services (UK) Ltd. By January 2025, 606 of the 640 properties were completed on budget, with a projected completion date of March 2025. All key performance indicators regarding energy efficiency and carbon reduction targets have been met. The project has positively impacted the local economy, injecting approximately £5.4 million and creating job and training opportunities.
